# **Summer Youth Program Participants Gain Work Experience and Valuable Certifications**

In this year's TANF (Temporary Assistance for Needy Families) Summer Youth Program, 34

students successfully completed the six week LEED (Leadership in Energy & Environ-

mental Design) program, which is an internationally recognized green building certification system, and took the **LEED certification** test. Students also built 25 desk top computers which were donated to local non-profit organizations such as the Dawn Center, Gulf Coast Community Care, Cares, and other community service providers. Explorations into many aspects of going green were covered during this course and will help equip participants with the skills and knowledge base to compete in the technology driven, green job market of the future.



This year's WIA Summer Youth Program has been very productive, allowing the **90 youth to experience what it's really like to be employed**. Internships were developed with the interest of the students in mind, helping them gain valuable employment skills and work experience. To date, 60 of the 90 participants are involved in or have completed their Internships and an additional **30 youth are participating in our one week orientation**. Taking the time to prepare the youth for their Internships, has proven to make the experience a much more positive one. We are very thankful for the support and participation of the many employers of Pasco and Hernando County that have opened the doors of opportunity for the area's youth.

# PHWB 's New Quarterly Overview Provides Comprehensive Data to Employers and Job

**Seekers.** The Region 16 Employment and Workforce Overview is a snap shot report which compiles data generated locally and by the State of Florida into graphic representations of impor-

tant labor-related economic factors. As such, the report explores what industries in the Pasco Hernando Workforce Region are growing and identifies those in decline. This information assists job seekers in indentifying new career opportunities and provides businesses with the information they need to evaluate local economic conditions so they can grow and thrive. Other information contained in the report looks at local wage rates and how they compare to neighboring counties and the entire state. Additional graphs and charts present unemployment and education data as they relate to our local workforce.

This snap shot report will not remain static. Staff will update the report as new data is released and will explore other sources to better focus on our region's workforce and economy.

I would like to thank you and your staff for being so accommodating in assisting my company in recruitment efforts for the Wal-Mart remodel project in Spring Hills. You and your business services partner, Maribel, were especially helpful in reserving the facilities at both Spring Hill and New Port Richey, and coordinating the assistance of the Career Central recruitment staff in each location. We have had several very successful job fairs over the past two weeks that have allowed us to ramp up for this twelve week project.

Also, I would like to thank you for the referral of Matt Garry, who has become our Project Manager for the remodel. Matt has already gotten off to a great start and works closely with your supporting staff in both locations.

What is potentially just as exciting is that this could be the first of many Wal-Mart remodels in Pasco and Hernando counties that we will be asked to provide staff for over the next two years.

Career Central Cares, a quarterly incentive program for staff offered by the PHWB, will be holding its inaugural kick off event on Saturday, September 11, 2010, by assisting with the construction of a home through Habitat for Humanity of East and Central Pasco. Career Central encourages its employees and the employees of its contractors, to give 10 hours of community

service per quarter to help make our community a better place to live.

Habitat for Humanity is a non-profit organization that strives to promote self-reliance through home ownership. Participating family's provide "sweat equity" and through their hard work, the work of volunteers and donated materials from local businesses, they are able to purchase the homes through a no-interest mortgage, at a much lower cost than conventional construction. The mortgage payments of the participating families are then used to fund more homes.

The Career Central Cares kick off event will take place in Dade City at 8:00 am on Saturday, September 11, 2010. 10-15 volunteers are needed to staff the PHWB crew.
